SCC JUNIOR SECTION MISSION, VALUES and INFORMATION SHEET FOR 2022 SEASON

At Sissinghurst CC we have a clear mission in terms of what we want to achieve within our Junior Section. That mission is based on the following:

- Adhering to an inclusive 'One-Club' culture, serving young players, both male and female, and their families, whilst working in partnership with the Clubs Senior players, Committees, the local community, and schools.
- Providing top quality coaching and playing opportunities for young players of all abilities, furnishing, and nurturing a junior and then senior involvement in the game.
- Producing both male and female cricketers that achieve Area and County recognition, as well as developing all levels of league and social cricketers for the junior and senior sections.
- Fostering the development of young players in a safe and secure environment in accordance with the highest sporting values. Player safety will always be put above participation.
- Creating and promoting a year-group parental programme that actively encourages the involvement of parents in the development of the junior section.
- Strengthening the Junior Section's culture to ensure an environment that is supportive and inspiring for its young cricketers.

To achieve this mission, there are several core values and behaviours that we expect all players and parents to adhere to should they want to be members of Sissinghurst Cricket Club. These are as follows:

- All players must practice and play within the laws and in the spirit of the game.
- All players must encourage their respective teammates irrespective of the level of individual involvement.
- All players must respect their opponents irrespective of the competitive nature of the fixtures.
- All players must be polite to umpires and respect their decisions. Do not show dissent by either word or deed.
- Listen to your coaches respect them and work hard to gain their respect.
- Know when and where you have a match or training session being late is disrespectful to both your teammates and coaches.
- Invest in and wear the right Club kit, take pride in your appearance and your Club.
- At Under 11 level and above all players will be expected to have their own equipment including a protective box, thigh pads and helmet which must be worn for all hard-ball sessions
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke or consume alcohol on club premises or whilst representing the club.
- Parents are expected to adhere to the same level of etiquette and behavior as is expected of their children, unsporting behaviour will not be tolerated.
- If there is a problem speak to your coach, the Head of the Junior Section or the Welfare Officer.

How Do We Measure Success?

There are some key fundamentals to measuring our success that, if achieved, contribute to making SCC a "SPECIAL" Club. These are:

- **S**uccess in all age-group League and Cup competitions.
- Production of excellent cricketers that fulfil their full potential as Junior members.
- Enjoyment of the game for all, irrespective of ability or gender.
- **C**ontinuity and quality in the coaching across all age groups.
- Involvement of parents both willingly and productively in support of the age group Lead and Support Coaches and the Junior Section generally.
- **A**n active social programme that involves both parents and children in support of the Club and its stakeholders.
- **L**egacy of junior members who go on to represent the Club's senior sides.

It is important for players and parents alike to understand that from Under 13 and above the Club is playing cricket in a League within which the standard, generally, improves year on year.

It is a competitive League, and the Club makes no bones of the fact that it aspires to win in both League and Cup formats. This can sometimes mean that not all team members get to bat or bowl in certain fixtures. On pitch decisions are left to the Captain and their leadership team (usually three senior players) as part of their strategic development as cricketers, which is actively encouraged by the League, but does not always lead to equal participation.

The Club fully recognises that it can be a real challenge to effectively manage the balance between cricket for all and the participation of Area and/or County level players in competitive League fixtures. We will always attempt to organise intra-Club games or friendlies against other Clubs that allows wider participation, but we may not get it right all the time. As such, in a desire to be **open and transparent**, we would ask that parents, who maybe concerned by this, discuss their child's involvement with the Head of the Junior Section before committing to the payment of the Annual Subs.

2021 SEASON REVIEW

The 2021 season will be remembered for the rain which did its best to fall primarily on match days creating a real slog to get games played.

The Club was able to maintain both practice and playing protocols that created a safe environment within which both players and coaches could enjoy their cricket. Across all our Age Groups we once gain enjoyed great success. The Under 9's made the Kent Kwik Cricket County finals, the U11's made the final of the Weald of Kent Junior League Cup Competition and the Under 13's completed a third successive unbeaten league season winning the Weald of Kent Junior Under 13 League for an unprecedented third season running.

Girls Cricket - Kent Girls Under 13's "EIGHTY" League

We have been approached by Kent Cricket Board to enquire as to whether Sissinghurst Cricket Club would participate in the Kent Girls Under 13's "EIGHTY" League in 2022. Kent's aim is to develop the most progressive club girls cricket league in the country. It is based on adapting the rules of the highly successful ECB 2021 The Hundred competition. The Kent's Girls Club Under 13s "EIGHTY League will start in May 2022. It will involve at least 16 teams divided into four cluster groups and will operate on Sunday afternoons until mid-July. The Finals Day will take place in early September. Matches are 8 aside, hardball, pairs cricket.

In order for SCC to be eligible <u>all players must be members of the club</u>. We can field one Year 9 as long as they are not a current county player.

This presents a fantastic opportunity for the girls however it is hugely dependent on the following:

- 1. We must have at least 12 girls in Years 7 and 8 (possibly the better players in Year 6) who are playing hardball cricket at school.
- 2. If we commit, we MUST have full commitment from the girls to be available for all match days.

From last year's membership numbers, we will not have enough players available so we need to make a real push to increase membership.

We will continue to run softball cricket for a younger less experienced girl members. We are also exploring the potential for a Weld of Kent Junior Girls Softball League to ensure some competitive matches during the season.

REGISTRATION

I am delighted that Christina Dyas has agreed to continue with the Junior Administration duties for this coming season.

Last year we requested everyone to complete new registration documents to ensure that our records are up to date.

If you registered last season and there are no major changes of detail e.g., Change of address / contact numbers etc then there is no need to complete forms again this year.
