SCC JUNIOR SECTION MISSION, VALUES and INFORMATION SHEET FOR 2024 SEASON

At Sissinghurst CC we have a clear mission in terms of what we want to achieve within our Junior Section. That mission is based on the following:

- Adhering to an inclusive 'One-Club' culture, serving young players, both male and female, and their families, whilst working in partnership with the Clubs Senior players, Committees, the local community, and schools.
- Providing top quality coaching and playing opportunities for young players of all abilities, furnishing, and nurturing a junior and then senior involvement in the game.
- Producing both male and female cricketers that achieve Area and County recognition, as well as developing all levels of league and social cricketers for the junior and senior sections.
- Fostering the development of young players in a safe and secure environment in accordance with the highest sporting values. Player safety will always be put above participation.
- Creating and promoting a year-group parental programme that actively encourages the involvement of parents in the development of the junior section.
- Strengthening the Junior Section's culture to ensure an environment that is supportive and inspiring for its young cricketers.

To achieve this mission, there are several core values and behaviours that we expect all players and parents to adhere to should they want to be members of Sissinghurst Cricket Club. These are as follows:

- All players must practice and play within the laws and in the spirit of the game.
- All players must encourage their respective teammates irrespective of the level of individual involvement.
- All players must respect their opponents irrespective of the competitive nature of the fixtures.
- All players must be polite to umpires and respect their decisions. Do not show dissent by either word or deed.
- Listen to your coaches respect them and work hard to gain their respect.
- Know when and where you have a match or training session being late is disrespectful to both your teammates and coaches.
- Invest in and wear the right Club kit, take pride in your appearance and your Club.
- At Under 11 level and above all players will be expected to have their own equipment including a protective box, thigh pads and helmet which must be worn for all hard-ball sessions.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke or consume alcohol on club premises or whilst representing the club.
- Parents are expected to adhere to the same level of etiquette and behavior as is expected of their children, unsporting behaviour will not be tolerated.
- If there is a problem speak to your coach, the Head of the Junior Section or the Welfare Officer.

How Do We Measure Success?

There are some key fundamentals to measuring our success that, if achieved, contribute to making SCC a "SPECIAL" Club. These are:

- **S**uccess in all age-group League and Cup competitions.
- **P**roduction of excellent cricketers that fulfil their full potential as Junior members.
- **E**njoyment of the game for all, irrespective of ability or gender.
- **C**ontinuity and quality in the coaching across all age groups.
- Involvement of parents both willingly and productively in support of the age group Lead and Support Coaches and the Junior Section generally.
- An active social programme that involves both parents and children in support of the Club and its stakeholders.
- Legacy of junior members who go on to represent the Club's senior sides.

It is important for players and parents alike to understand that from Under 13 and above the Club is playing cricket in a League within which the standard, generally, improves year on year.

It is a competitive League, and the Club makes no bones of the fact that it aspires to win in both League and Cup formats. This can sometimes mean that not all team members get to bat or bowl in certain fixtures. On pitch decisions are left to the Captain and their leadership team (usually three senior players) as part of their strategic development as cricketers, which is actively encouraged by the League, but does not always lead to equal participation.

The Club fully recognises that it can be a real challenge to effectively manage the balance between cricket for all and the participation of Area and/or County level players in competitive League fixtures. We will always attempt to organise intra-Club games or friendlies against other Clubs that allows wider participation, but we may not get it right all the time. As such, in a desire to be **open and transparent**, we would ask that parents, who maybe concerned by this, discuss their child's involvement with the Head of the Junior Section before committing to the payment of the Annual Subs.

2023 SEASON REVIEW

Well, what a season of very strange weather! Having started with record breaking rainfall in March and April which not only made it impossible to complete any pre-season pitch preparation but also led to the delay of the season start, we ended it with seven consecutive days in September with temperatures of more than 30 degrees centigrade. This will bring with it a large number of additional pressures particularly in relation to the necessary improvements to our Senior Section. In order to ensure that the Junior Section remains as progressive as ever we are delighted that Lewis Clift has agreed to become Head of Junior Boys and Ben Stinton, Head of Junior Girls. Their roles will be to continue the development of the playing and coaching programmes across the sections whilst Simon Latham maintains an involvement in the management and administration.

The Weald of Kent Junior League will once again be running competitions at U9 (Kwik cricket), U11 hardball and softball, U13 and U15 levels with additional U18 friendlies for the boys. In order to increase the amount of match time across our U13 boys we will be entering both a Year 7 and Year 8 side to the Under 13 League and Cup Competitions this year. This is very much an exploratory season, but we feel that this best offers as many of our Under 13 players competitive cricket during the season.

For our ever-growing girl's section there will be Weald of Kent softball and hardball Leagues sitting alongside the KCC Hardball 80 Competition and the Kent Countdown Softball Competition. Ben Stinton will also be reviewing other opportunities to both add technical coaching to our training programme and additional hardball matches.

Most of the League fixtures will be during the weeks of the Schools Summer Term except Cup Finals which will be at the end of August for all except the Under 9's. Once the Fixtures have been agreed we will circulate to all those signed up members across the Age Groups so that dates get in your diary early. There is one very important change to our Membership Policy this Year.

Due to the high level of interest in becoming Junior Members of Sissinghurst Cricket Club, we must ask that all Junior Members are available for team selection other commitments, outside of cricket, allowing.
