SCC JUNIOR SECTION MISSION, VALUES and INFORMATION SHEET FOR 2025 SEASON

At Sissinghurst CC we have a clear mission in terms of what we want to achieve within our Junior Section. That mission is based on the following:

- Adhering to an inclusive 'One-Club' culture, serving young players, both male and female, and their families, whilst working in partnership with the Clubs Senior players, Committees, the local community, and schools.
- Providing top quality coaching and playing opportunities for young players of all abilities, furnishing, and nurturing a junior and then senior involvement in the game.
- Producing both male and female cricketers that achieve Area and County recognition, as well as developing all levels of league and social cricketers for the junior and senior sections.
- Fostering the development of young players in a safe and secure environment in accordance with the highest sporting values. Player safety will always be put above participation.
- Creating and promoting a year-group parental programme that actively encourages the involvement of parents in the development of the junior section.
- Strengthening the Junior Section's culture to ensure an environment that is supportive and inspiring for its young cricketers.

To achieve this mission, there are several core values and behaviours that we expect all players and parents to adhere to should they want to be members of Sissinghurst Cricket Club. These are as follows:

- All players must practice and play within the laws and in the spirit of the game.
- All players must encourage their respective teammates irrespective of the level of individual involvement.
- All players must respect their opponents irrespective of the competitive nature of the fixtures.
- All players must be polite to umpires and respect their decisions. Do not show dissent by either word or deed.
- Listen to your coaches respect them and work hard to gain their respect.
- Know when and where you have a match or training session being late is disrespectful to both your teammates and coaches.
- Invest in and wear the right Club kit, take pride in your appearance and your Club.
- At Under 11 level and above all players will be expected to have their own equipment including a protective box, thigh pads and helmet which must be worn for all hard-ball sessions.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke or consume alcohol on club premises or whilst representing the club.
- Parents are expected to adhere to the same level of etiquette and behavior as is expected of their children, unsporting behaviour will not be tolerated.
- If there is a problem speak to your coach, the Head of the Junior Section or the Welfare Officer.

There are some key fundamentals to measuring our success that, if achieved, contribute to making SCC a "SPECIAL" Club. These are:

- **S**uccess in all age-group League and Cup competitions.
- **P**roduction of excellent cricketers that fulfil their full potential as Junior members.
- **E**njoyment of the game for all, irrespective of ability or gender.
- Continuity and quality in the coaching across all age groups.
- Involvement of parents both willingly and productively in support of the age group Lead and Support Coaches and the Junior Section generally.
- **A**n active social programme that involves both parents and children in support of the Club and its stakeholders.
- Legacy of junior members who go on to represent the Club's senior sides.

It is important for players and parents alike to understand that from Under 13 and above the Club is playing cricket in a League within which the standard, generally, improves year on year.

It is a competitive League, and the Club makes no bones of the fact that it aspires to win in both League and Cup formats. This can sometimes mean that not all team members get to bat or bowl in certain fixtures. On pitch decisions are left to the Captain and their leadership team (usually three senior players) as part of their strategic development as cricketers, which is actively encouraged by the League, but does not always lead to equal participation.

The Club fully recognises that it can be a real challenge to effectively manage the balance between cricket for all and the participation of Area and/or County level players in competitive League fixtures. We will always attempt to organise intra-Club games or friendlies against other Clubs that allows wider participation, but we may not get it right all the time. As such, in a desire to be **open and transparent**, we would ask that parents, who maybe concerned by this, discuss their child's involvement with the Head of the Junior Section before committing to the payment of the Annual Subs.

It has been another fantastic year for junior cricket at Sissinghurst. With over 60 junior games and tournaments played across all age groups, it has been a busy but hugely enjoyable experience.

LOOKING FORWARD TO THE 2025 SEASON

There is much to be excited about as we look forward to the forthcoming season.

With Simon Latham completing his first season as Chairman of SCC, Lewis Clift has agreed to take responsibility for the Junior Cricket and will assume the overarching role of Head of Junior Cricket. Ben Stinton will continue overseeing the girls' provision as Head of Junior Girls.

We are proud to have Benenden School joining JM Finn and TN17 as kit sponsors. The new kit is available to purchase now from the Club Shop, accessible from the SCC website or by following the link below: https://teamwear.nxt-sports.com/shop/sissinghurst-cricket-club.

Before you look to purchase new playing shirts we wanted to make you aware of a "sale window" which will open for last three weeks of January 2025, from 13th to 31st January. During that window Mazuri have agreed to offer the following discounts:

- 1. Senior long sleeve playing shirts reduced from £40 to £33.
- 2. Senior short sleeve playing shirts reduced from £36 to £30
- 3. Junior boys and girls short sleeve playing shirts reduced from £30 to £22.50

To further offset the cost of purchase, it was agreed at the Club's AGM last month that we will make a £10 deduction to the 2025 Annual Membership Fee as a contribution to the cost of the shirts. As such the net costs of the new shirts will be £23, £20 and £12.50 respectively.

At the end of January prices will revert to the full cost.

The Weald of Kent Junior League will once again be running competitions at U9 (Kwik cricket), U11 hardball and softball, U13 and U15 levels with additional U18 friendlies for the boys. In order to increase the amount of match time across our U13 boys we will continue to enter both a Year 7 and Year 8 side to the Under 13 League and Cup Competitions. This was a successful venture last year with the Year 8 side winning the league and the Yr 7 reaching the cup semi and finishing mid table in the league.

For our ever-growing girl's section there will be Weald of Kent hardball Leagues sitting alongside the KCC Hardball 80 Competition and the Kent Countdown Softball Competition. In an exciting venture, Ben Stinton will be introducing a ladies team to Sissinghurst. This will allow our older girls to continue to represent the club, providing consistent long term performance opportunities.

Most of the League fixtures will be during the weeks of the Schools Summer Term except Cup Finals which will be at the end of August for all except the Under 9's. Once the Fixtures have been agreed we will circulate to all those signed up members across the Age Groups so that dates get in your diary early. It is hugely important to team planning that you let your Team Manager know dates your child will NOT be available at the earliest opportunity.

All our fixtures will, once again, be coordinated through the Spond App so please make sure you have signed up.

We wanted to highlight a key change to our Membership Policy made last Year.

Due to the high level of interest in becoming Junior Members of Sissinghurst Cricket Club, we must ask that all Junior Members are available for team selection other commitments, outside of cricket, allowing. This means that Sissinghurst Cricket Club Junior Members should avoid also being members of other cricket clubs that participate in the Weald of Kent Junior Cricket League fixtures and/or clubs that participate in the Cricket Festivals organised by KCC where dual membership would preclude selection for Sissinghurst Cricket Club.

This will ensure that membership is allocated to players that want to both train with and play for Sissinghurst Cricket Club. It is incumbent on new/existing members to inform the Club of any dual membership at the time of joining the Club or renewing an annual membership.
